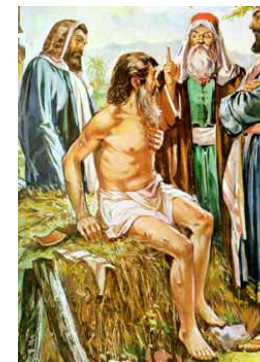

Pastor: Opening Prayer
